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Change in the HR department of Commerzbank: Matthias Füssel, Head of HR at ING Germany, to succeed Martin Fishedick

Matthias Füssel, currently Head of Human Resources at ING-DiBa AG Germany and a member of the ING Group's Global HR Management Team, will take over as Executive Management Board Member GM-HR with effect from 1 July 2024. He will be succeeding Martin Fishedick who commenced his career at Commerzbank more than 35 years ago and has since held a number of management positions in Germany and abroad. He has worked in his current role in HR for almost ten years and has played a crucial role in the transformation of Commerzbank.

For his successor Matthias Füssel, the appointment is a return to Commerzbank, where he was responsible for labour law in the legal department from 2017 to 2019.
